There will be loads of book related activities happening during the week in the Library and book inspired activities, including, "THE MASKED READER" on the day.

All entries must be in by <u>Friday 1st March</u> to give the teachers time to go through all of the work. Winners will be announced at the World Book Day Awards Ceremony on Thursday 7th March.

Please, please make sure that all entries have the following information: Pupil's name, Year group and Competition Category \ Title

Competition 1: My Favourite Book

Reception, Year 1 and Year 2

Draw a picture of your favourite book. Add some words about why this is your favourite book. How does it make you feel? Do you like the illustrations? It can be on either A4 or A3 sized paper.

Competition 2: Best Book Review

Year 1 and Year 2

Write a review of your favourite book using only five words. For example, 'funny, colourful, silly, happy, crazy!' or 'this book makes me laugh'

Year 3, Year 4, Year 5, Year 6

Write a review of your favourite book. What makes you love it? How would you describe it without giving away the story? How could you encourage someone to read it? Read the blurb or online reviews for other books to help you.

Competition 3: Best Screen Play

Year 5, Year 6, Year 7, Year 8, Year 9

Write a play or scene based on your favourite book, character or illustration. Think about the setting, characters, lighting, weather, time period etc. Is it moody, stormy and dark? Will it be set in reality or a fantasy setting? Does it take place in modern day or in the past?

Competition 4: Best Set Design

All year groups

'Have a go' at illustrating a scene from a book. It could be anything from the inside of Mary Poppin's magical bag, Diary of a Wimpy Kid's classroom, Paddington Bear's home in Peru to the Gruffalo's home.

Thank you for continuing to support World Book Day, it enables us to celebrate the magical world of books and the joy they bring to us all.
